## **MORE THAN JUST A HIP-HOP FAD, ATLANTA RAP GROUP WANTS TO BE KNOWN AS ONE OF THE GREATS**

**Jan. 28, Atlanta, GA** - Atlanta has been producing major musical talent over the last couple of years and its upcoming group, Big Money Stackin (BMS), wants to make it proud.

“The South is doing its thing right now,” Rapper G-Cess said. “We not only want to be apart of it, we want to lead the way.”

BMS includes four young men: Gutter, 20, Envy, 17, G-Cess, 19 and Young Don, 17. They all knew each other in high school but became an official group in 2004. Since they have hooked up, things have been steadily progressing. After gaining exposure by hyping up over 2,000 May’s High School students during a talent show, BMS has gone on to perform at numerous venues in Atlanta.

Their time is currently being spent recording at the infamous, Patchwerk Recording Studio and perfecting their rhymes. “People don’t really think of Southern rappers as great lyricists,” Gutter said. “We want to show people we have more to offer than just popping your fingers. We actually have something to say.”

The “narrators of the streets” are currently signed to the independent label, Stillwell Entertainment, and are shopping for deals from major labels.
